- 4. Explanation of Overall Economic Impact of Proposed Rule.
 - A. Economic Impact on State Government.

These rules do not have an economic impact on State Government.

B. Economic Impact on Political Subdivisions; Specific Industries; Specific groups of citizens.

These rules will authorize dealers to sell motor vehicles at temporary additional locations. It is anticipated that such sales will stimulate the motor vehicle retailing industry.

C. Economic Impact on Citizens/Public at Large.

These rules have little impact on the public at large except that additional vehicle transactions result in additional revenue for the State Road Fund.
